Mater Filiius. We plan to keep our Early Learning

Childhood Center open for as long as our moms are able to work. We are monitoring the health of all in our care and grateful to our staff and volunteers who hold the needs of our families close at heart.

Speaking of families, between August 2019 and April 2020 there were 15 people (all ages) residing at Mater Filiius. Our moms learned some immeasurable life lessons: They learned to swap cooking days when needed, to have direct conversations, and to resolve issues on their own. Bravery takes on a whole new meaning when you share a kitchen with four other women.

When our moms first enter Mater Filiius they are skeptical towards us "friendly church ladies." Why would we help them and expect nothing in return? A few

weeks down the road they start to trust us and allow their guards to come down. They appreciate the opportunities afforded them. Eventually a rock gets in their way and they stumble. Wait a minute, they think, this is really hard. Is it worth it?

Some start to resent the rules and challenge all that they see that is unfair in this world and right inside Mater Filiius. This is a painful, painful moment of truth. It is a courageous woman and valiant mom who will fight through her pain, own up to her past mistakes, vow to do better and, most importantly, ask for help when needed.

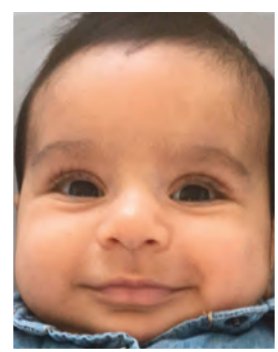
Thankfully more and more of our moms are willing to fight through this battle and go on to a better, healthier life. This is when the miracles pour forth.

They helped me get into the UNMC Neurology department where I was diagnosed with Huntington's Disease. I was devastated, but I was not surprised because it runs in my family. I appreciate the support everyone gave me.

I had not practiced my Catholic faith for years, but I enjoyed Rita's workshops on Spirituality. One night she was teaching us about Our Lady of Guadalupe and I felt a warm hug around my shoulders. I looked to see who hugged me, but no one was there. Rita was sitting across the room. I asked her if she saw who had hugged me and she gave me a strange look so I knew she didn't see anything. It was a real hug! I know it was our Mother telling me it was all going to be okay. She would be with me.

My daughter Hayden was born in October. I love my daughter so much and she is just so sweet. Hayden lives with my sister and her family, and I spend as much time with her as I can. In February I moved to a new home called Omaha Supportive Living. I am grateful that Hayden still gets to come to Mater Filius every day to ECLC.

It is something I try to remember every day. God had a plan for me when I came to Mater Filius, and I know he has a plan for me and Hayden now. I knew I needed resources to overcome whatever obstacles would come my way. I ended up receiving and leaving Mater Filius with so much more than I expected.

The group therapy taught me how to properly handle conflicts with others and understand the importance of self worth. I was able to develop a personal relationship with God freely and I had access to a beautiful chapel a floor down from where I slept. I established a list of good habits that I follow today like daily prayer, making a good breakfast, being frugal, delighting in my child's experiences and nurturing her needs consistently. They are simple things, but the key building blocks to a good life.

I received a scholarship through the Christ Child Society with the help of Mater Filius. This money went toward my tuition at UNO and I was able to purchase my first car with the money I had saved working. I have made the Dean's List the last two Fall Semesters.

Lastly, Monica attends the ECLC in Mater Filius where she's been cared for and loved by the most amazing people I've ever met. Knowing that she is in good hands while I am at work and at school is very comforting.
